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## **Iceland plays pivotal role in creation of moneyless world in Amazon Kindle Top 100 book 'F-Day: The Second Dawn of Man'**

**August 8, 2017** - Iceland has featured heavily in Amazon Kindle Top 100 book 'F-Day: The Second Dawn of Man' by Irish social activist, musician, 'Moneyless Man' and author Colin R. Turner, who believes the country could be the ideal place to start creating a moneyless world.

The book follows disillusioned Karl Drayton who, realising that the monetary system is at the heart of everything that's wrong in the world, sets about the mammoth task of changing things, starting with the creation of a Free World Charter, a set of 10 guiding principles for conducting human affairs equitably and sustainably without money.

The Free World Charter goes viral, gaining over 1 million signatures, and the countdown of the F-Day clock to a future world free of money begins. TV exposure ensues and Karl proposes Iceland as the perfect first country to become money free.

While the book is a work of fiction, author Colin R. Turner sees it as a possible blueprint to a real moneyless world, and maintains Iceland could be the key to its creation.

"I chose Iceland for the pivotal role in the book shortly after I visited the island in 2013," comments Colin. "I was so inspired by the spirit and resilience of the community that I thought it would be the perfect setting for the story. Another consideration was Iceland's mostly self-sufficient status thanks to its geothermal energy potential. But it's the Icelandic community spirit and forward-thinking people that really get things moving. And it doesn't take a genius to see where I got that impression. While the rest of the Western world was brought to its knees thanks to 2008's economic crisis, Iceland simply jailed the bankers who were responsible."

The Free World Charter featured in the book now has its own place in reality and has garnered over 56,000 signatures from 211 countries worldwide, indicating a serious appetite for a systemic change.

Colin has further developed the ideas of creating a free world in his free non-fiction book 'Into The Open Economy', which discusses the flaws of the current monetary system and proposes logical working alternatives that are aligned with the principles of the Free World Charter.

He has also led the development of a unique goods and services swapping site – Freeworlder.com - that has the aim of turning the free world idea into reality, and already has hundreds of active users.

"As Icelanders already know, people working together can achieve great things," says Colin. "The world is in a terrible state of affairs and things will only get worse if we continue down our current path, where money and profit come at the expense of everything else. A free world is not only possible, it's inevitable. The only question is how long it will take us to realise it and make it happen."
